## First Aid Supplies for Your Pets

Keep the following supplies on-hand, in case your pets ever experience an emergency.

- Phone numbers for your veterinarian, local emergency clinic, and the Animal Poison Control Center
- Your pet's medical record
- Gauze for wrapping wounds or muzzling an injured pet
- Nonstick bandages, towels, or strips of clean cloth (do NOT use adhesive bandages on pets) - to control bleeding and protect wounds
- Adhesive tape for bandages
- Milk of magnesia and/or activated charcoal to absorb a toxic substance. NEVER treat your pet for poison until you have consulted with your veterinarian or the poison control center.
- Hydrogen Peroxide (3%) to induce vomiting
- Digital Thermometer (one designed to read high fever temperatures) temperatures must be taken rectally
- + Eye dropper or large syringe to give oral medication or flush out wounds
- Muzzle to cover your pet's head and prevent your pet from biting. NEVER muzzle an animal that is vomiting.
- + Leash to transport your pet
- Stretcher, blanket or floor mat if an injured animal needs to be stabilized during transport
- Anti-diarrheal medication
- Antibiotic ointment
- Latex gloves
- Tweezers
- Disinfectant or chlorine bleach to sanitize
